- ☐ **Communication:** Open, clear, and respectful exchange of information
- ☐ **Trust:** Confidence in the intentions and actions of others
- ☐ **Respect:** Recognition of each person's dignity and perspective
- ☐ **Role clarity:** Understanding responsibilities and expectations
- ☐ **Participation:** Involvement of all stakeholders in decision-making
